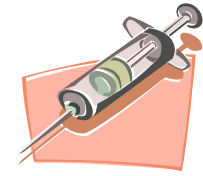


Home Generated Sharps Program



“Home-generated sharps” are needles, syringes, and lancets that people use at home to manage an illness. When sharps are improperly disposed of they are a threat to sanitation workers, adults, children, and even pets due to needlestick injuries. Due to the high risk to the community and environment, California Law makes it illegal to place home-generated sharps in the trash or recyclable containers.

How to properly and safely dispose of your sharps:

- Place used home-generated sharps in a commercial, **biohazard sharps container**. A red, biohazard sharps container can be purchased at your local pharmacy. Contact your pharmacist, clinic, or personal physician, and ask if they have a take-back program in place.
- **Mail Back Services:** If you purchase sharps on-line, request a pre-addressed, prepaid mail-back box for your used sharps. A list of mail back services approved by the California Department of Public Health can be found at this website: www.cdph.ca.gov/certlic/medicalwaste
- In Santa Clara and other county’s **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Programs** may accept home-generated sharps from residents. Be Smart about Sharps

You can prevent injury, illness and pollution by following these simple steps:

- Always use your own personal lancets, lancet device and meter when testing your blood sugar.
- Do not use your lancets or meter to test other people’s blood sugar.
- **Do not recap or bend “dirty” lancets or needles.** It is especially important for caregivers to prevent unnecessary needlesticks.
- Promptly dispose of used lancets, needles, syringes and other sharp objects in a commercial, red sharps container. When the contents reach the “full” line on the container, seal it tightly.
- Don’t mix sharps container with other waste materials or recycling. California law requires disposing of sharps at approved locations. (Attached is a list of drop-off locations).
- Please keep all sharps and sharp containers out of reach of children and pets. Lastly, any surfaces exposed to blood should be cleaned up immediately with soap and water and then disinfected with a germicidal solution or 10% bleach.
